RISE AGAINST HUNGER

September 16, 2017 - Hermitage Baptist Church



On Saturday, September 16th, the Mid-Tidewater Baptist Association family will come together in a joint effort to pack 20,000 meals that will be given to the *Rise Against Hunger* organization. Rise Against Hunger is an international hunger relief organization that distributes food and life-changing aid to the world's most vulnerable, mobilizing the necessary resources to end hunger by 2030. This organization is committed to reducing the number of people who die daily because they do not have enough nutritious food to eat. It is hard to imagine that in a world that can put men on the moon, robots on Mars, wireless computers, cell phones, and robotic cars, we still have not found a way to unite nations around a worldwide effort to end starvation. Here are just two facts that should just break our hearts:

- (1) 792.5 million people in the world don't get the food they need to live a healthy life and
- (2) 66 million primary school-age children attend classes hungry across the developing world.

Those two facts alone were enough to motivate the Community Ministries Team to make **Rise Against Hunger** one of their mission projects for the MTBA in 2017. Here is how it works: **Rise Against Hunger's** meal packaging program is a volunteer-based initiative that coordinates the assembly-line packaging of highly nutritious dehydrated meals comprised of rice, soy, vegetables, and 23 essential vitamins and minerals. The MTBA's goal is to pack 20,000 meals on Saturday, September 16. Those 20,000 meals will be boxed and loaded into a truck and taken to the central place of distribution. From the distribution center these meals will be sent to the most needy communities all over the world. Because of our effort on September 16, men and women, boys and girls that we will more than likely never meet, will have a better day, and a better chance at life.

We do this because we believe it is what God has called us to do. We do this, because we know we have been blessed to live in a country that has so much. We do this because the MTBA family is a loving, generous, and caring faith community. It is not a sacrifice for us, but a joy to give in this way.

This is what you need to do to be a part of the Rise Against Hunger Packing Day on September 16:

- 1. Sign up for one of the four teams: (8:30 am-9:30 am Set Up Team), (9:30 am-11:30 am Packing Team), (1 pm-3 pm Packing Team), (3 pm-4 pm Loading and Clean Up Team).
- 2. If your church has a team of volunteers, you can sign up with your church. If your church is not sending a team, you can call Barbara at the MTBA office (804-758-4385) and let her know what team you want to serve on.
- 3. We need 10 people for set up team, 50 people for each packing team, and 10 people for Loading and clean up team.
- 4. Lunch will be provided for all participants by the wonderful folks at Hermitage BC. Lunch will be served at 12 noon. Their plan is for a hot dog / hamburger cookout .

MTBA Spring Association Meeting

Since this year's Spring Meeting was at St. Stephens, it seemed like a good idea to focus this year's meeting on some of the significant events in the life of some of our MTBA churches. To capture the mood of a time that was long long ago, all the electrical lights were turned off and the program began with only candle and natural lighting.



The look back started with our two oldest churches, Glebe Landing and Lower King and (Rev. Mark Holland, Host Pastor) Queen. It was shared how Rev. John Waller played an instrumental role in the establishment of our two oldest churches. We were reminded that Rev. John Waller's convictions concerning religious freedom were so strong that he ended up being sent to the Urbanna jail. We once again heard that the religious freedom that we so enjoy came at a high price and that it was paid for by men and women like Rev. John Waller.

The Program Committee presented a birthday cake to the gathering to celebrate the 175th birthdays of Olivet, Saluda, and St. Stephens churches. Of course that led to the singing of Happy Birthday to these three very special churches in the MTBA. And our three churches look mighty fine considering they are celebrating their 175th birthday.



The next stop down memory lane was 1959. This was the year that the MTBA was established and who better to tell that story than our own Rev. Edward Harrow, who was a participant in that meeting. He shared that the decision to leave the Rappahannock Baptist Association and to create a new association was not an easy one. There were several who objected to this idea and did not see any need to form a new association. But by the end of the meeting when the vote was taken, the decision was made to form the Mid-Tidewater Baptist Association.

The **Cooperating Award** was presented to **Spring Hill Baptist Church** in recognition of their partnership mission trip to Tanzania. The **Sharing Award** was presented to **Saluda Baptist Church** for the generous way they have made their people and facility available to so many in our community.
