Update on Strategy Planning Committee

The Strategy Planning Committee has just completed Phase One of their work. They have spent months looking at the work of previous strategy teams as well as talking with several Baptist leaders who have experience working with Baptist Associations. Here are several pieces that have begun to surface for the committee.

- There is not a feeling that the MTBA organization needs to go through some kind of major reorganization.
- The importance of fellowship cannot be overstated in a local association.
- A healthy balance between inward and outward focus in our MTBA churches.

At this point in the developmental process, the Strategy Planning Committee did not want to proceed any further without input from our MTBA pastors and church leadership. Therefore they developed a Listening Hub Strategy. It works like this:

- We are asking 6 churches to serve as a host church for 4 other churches that are located close to host church.
- The MTBA will provide a meal for those in attendance before the listening session begins.
- Each gathering will be led by a Facilitating Team made up of 3 members from the Strategy Planning Team.
 There will be 3 questions that each gathering will be asked to answer which should give the team the kind of input they are looking for from our churches.
- We are asking for each church to provide no more than 3 or 4 persons from each church to attend their listening session. These should be persons who can contribute in a productive way to this process. We need people who can think more on an associational level and not so much on a local church level for this effort.

Changes To Ministry Outreach Trailer

On November 7, the Administrative Committee, the MTBA staff, and our Middle Peninsula Insurance representative met to review our requirements for using the Ministry Trailer with the major focus being the use of the inflatables. After looking at all options and learning that there are companies who will deliver, set up, and pick up inflatables for as little as \$250 and carry all of the insurance, the Administrative Committee will make a recommendation at the MTBA January Executive Committee meeting to no longer include the inflatables in the Ministry Outreach Trailer. The plan is to sell the inflatables, ask the Youth Committee to look at making upgrades to the Ministry Outreach Trailer content, and have the MTBA office staff provide a list of companies who rent inflatables.

DISASTER RELIEF—NORTH AMERICAN MISSION BOARD

When Marilyn and I moved from Virginia to Georgia we had no idea what we would do once we retired. Moving to a new community presents many challenges and one of these is finding a church to belong to and serve in. It did not take long for us to find a church. We joined the First Baptist Church of Cumming, GA two months after we moved to Georgia. The next Sunday Marilyn began serving first as organist and later as pianist at First Baptist. This ministry has given her an opportunity to serve Christ through the music ministry of the church. While with the MTBA, I had the opportunity to become involved with the Disaster Relief ministry of the Baptist General Association of Virginia. It wasn't long before I met members of First Baptist Church of Cumming who were involved with the North American Mission Board's Disaster

Relief ministry. One of the major responsibilities of the NAMB is to provide assistance and coordination to state Baptist conventions when disaster strikes in the United States and even in foreign countries. We all know about the tens of thousands of Disaster Relief volunteers that serve through the many Baptist State conventions, what I did not realize was that the NAMB had its own set of volunteers. First, I worked in the NAMB Warehouse, located the basement of its building. The Warehouse stores many items that are needed to support the ministries of the state conventions. Second, part of NAMB's relief ministry is provide supplies and equipment through to state conventions. The logistic arm of the NAMB has trucks [semis and F-550s] that carry supplies and equipment [shower and laundry trailer, command trailers, mud-out trailers, etc.] to disaster stricken areas. Last year I was certified to drive the smaller trucks and have traveled many miles in this ministry. I did not retire to travel, but in this volunteer ministry I have traveled to many disaster areas to deliver supplies and equipment. This has been travel with a purpose, providing support and help to people in difficult circumstances. In addition to being a driver, I also have the responsibility of coordinating the volunteer drivers and the warehouse workers. The months of September and October were extremely busy for the NAMB's fulltime staff and volunteers. We loaded dozens of boxes, each weighing almost 300 pounds and holding items to be given first to Pastors in Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands, which the pastors and their congregations could use to minister to people in their communities. The boxes were then sent to major East Coast ports and shipped to Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands by air and sea. In addition, our trucks made many trips to Texas and Florida to deliver much needed equipment to the respective state convention DR ministries. Marilyn and I have been blessed by our retirement ministries and believe that the Lord was in our move to Georgia. And the wonderful thing is that we are blessed with the health and energy to be still be involved in ministry. I would like to thank the Mid-Tidewater Baptist Association for taking an offering for Disaster Relief at the Fall Meeting. The Disaster Relief ministry is supported, in large part, by contributions such as the one you made in October.
