REFLECTIONS OF FAITH

Lessons on faith can come from unexpected places. "Bear" was a 110 pound black Labrador retriever. Bear's large metal water bowl was located in a corner of the kitchen. Whenever it was empty, he wouldn't bark or paw at it. Instead he would lie down quietly beside it and wait. Sometimes he would have to wait for some time, but Bear had learned to trust that his master would eventually walk into the room, see him there, and provide what he needed. His simple faith in his master reminds us of our need to place our trust in God. Hebrews 11 tells us that "faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see". The foundation of this confidence and assurance is God Himself who "rewards those who earnestly seek Him". God is faithful to keep His promises to all who believe and come to Him through Jesus.
